Terms & Conditions of issuing Golf Exchange Card

The Golf Exchange Card, issued by either of the above mentioned clubs, allows the member to play completely free of charge at the other club, at any time, subject to availability and our Fair Use terms as detailed below.

The Pass must be issued and counter signed by a club official and the expiry date will fall in line with the cardholder's membership renewal date. At the beginning of a new membership year, members will need to request a new Pass, which will be issued by a club official after payment of the appropriate membership fee.

All members must check availability and book in advance. The valid Golf Exchange Pass should then be produced at the pro shop and a signing in register completed prior to teeing off. The user's signature will be used to validate the Pass and their personal information may be cross checked against up to date membership lists. Occasionally, a photo ID may also be requested.

Both Clubs reserve the right to cancel or amend any booking made under this scheme should an important re-arranged club fixture coincide with the booking, or in the case of a subsequent booking made by a paying society. In such circumstances, every possible effort will be made to accommodate the booking with minimum disruption to the Exchange Pass holder(s).

Any member who has their card lost or stolen should notify an official of their club as soon as possible. A £5.00 charge will be made for any replacement cards issued.

Fair Use Terms

This is a positive initiative, designed for the purpose of offering the members of both clubs significant added value to their usual membership package. It is important that the interests of both clubs are served by members acting fully within the 'spirit' of which the arrangement is intended. The existing home club for individual members will remain the home club and it is expected that each member will carry out the vast majority of their golfing activities here. Members are not permitted to enter the other club's competitions unless they are 'open' events. The Pass allows members to play at the other club for a change of scenery now and again without having to bear the cost of green fees. There is no restriction on the number of visits made with each Pass card. However, usage will be closely monitored and each club reserves the right to revoke the Pass should it be felt it is being used outside the 'spirit' of the arrangement – i.e. a member is deemed to be playing the away club more frequently than the home course.

In order to avoid any conflict of interest where one club may have a cheaper annual fee than the other, applications for membership from a person who has previously been a member of the other club will be considered, but that member will not be eligible to obtain the Golf Exchange Pass unless there is good reason to switch clubs – for example, moving into the other club's area. These cases will be reviewed by the relevant club on an individual basis.
